Money Raised to Support Scout Programs



Camp Cards

Over 30K in cards were sold by 38 units generating over \$15,000 in revenue for unit program

The Council's Scouts sold well over \$1 million in popcorn, up 13% from 2018

Growing Scouting

The Mount Baker Council provided program to 6,224 youth from across our Cub Scout, Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Exploring Programs

In its "Heroes Start Here" Campaign the Council saw 13.1% growth in Lions for 2019 with each district having Lion growth

20 new Scout units were started with 11 new Scouts BSA troops serving 100 of our first girls to the program

48 Packs helped bring Cub Scouting to 305 girls across the Council



Investing in Scouting

All three of the Council's Districts achieved over 100% of their FOS Pledge Goal in 2019. The Snohomish County Breakfast achieved another great year with over \$77,000 in income. The Districts held six additional giving events with community giving exceeding \$55,000 in 2019

The Mount Baker Council had 162 Scouts obtain the rank of Eagle Scout in 2019. They provided over 49606 hours of community service through their Eagle Projects.

Also in 2019 2603 Cub Scout ranks were awarded with 342 of them being the **Arrow of Light.**

To provide better program and support to our Scouting units the Districts of the Mount Baker Council were successfully formed into three new Districts in 2019:

- Salish Sea (covering Everett, Bothell, Mukilteo, Edmonds, Mill **Creek, and Mountlake Terrace)**
- Pilchuck (covering Marysville, Arlington, Camano Island, Stanwood, Lake Stevens, Snohomish, Monroe, Gold Bar)
- North Cascades (covering Skagit, Whatcom, San Juan Counties and Whidbey Island)

Charter Partners

On behalf of the Boy Scouts of America the Council partnered with 187 community organizations to provide the Scouting program through 277 Scouting units.
