Welcome to the Camporee

We have a big weekend planned for you and your Scouts. All Scouts BSA Troops, Teams, Venture Crews, & Arrow of Light Scouts are invited. This year's theme is "Wild West". The theme will be represented in the Games & Activities, as well as the skits and songs that each unit will perform at the Saturday evening Campfire. Camporee will be held at Fire Mountain Scout Camp near Mt. Vernon, Washington.

This is a great opportunity for unit camping, patrol development, Arrow of Light Recruitment, and Inter-unit Fellowship. Units will camp in the campistes. This event will strengthen the Patrols and Troops as they participate in this great event.

Registration

Arrow of Light are to register with a local Scout Troop as they will serve as a host Troop. You will be able to camp overnight with your host Troop. If you need help finding a host Troop, contact your District Executive, Drew Sheppard.

If anyone arrives on Saturday make sure that they get registered on the way in before participating in any of the activities planned for them.

Cost

Arrow of Light Scouts

Arrow of Light Scouts can register to attend Camporee as long as they register with a Scout Troop, which will act as their host. Arrow of Light leaders must arrange to have meals with the host troop or plan to provide your own meals. They must also arrange to camp Friday and Saturday nights with the host troop. Host troops can be a unit with which your Pack is already affiliated. Arrow of Light leaders and Scoutmasters are responsible for making arrangements for transportation, menu planning, cooking, and for submitting the registration forms together that include an accurate count of the number of Arrow of Light Scouts, Scouts, and registered adult leaders who will be camping overnight. Arrow of Light Scouts are encouraged to wear their Official uniform during the event.

A Scout related T-shirt will work as well during the activity time. Careful planning is recommended so that your Arrow of Light Scouts can have opportunities to participate in all the events. As a reminder 4th Grade Webelos may no longer attend camporee per the Guide to Safe Scouting, Arrow of Light scouts are 5th grade scouts in a pack.

Check-In on Friday

Where to go – Check in will be next to the parking lot

Unloading your gear – As is standard Fire Mountain policy we will be allowing ONE vehicle to each campsite at a time managed by staff in the parking lot. The gate in the parking lot will be manned to allow access until 9PM on Friday evening. That gate will be manned again Sunday morning starting at 7AM. Vehicles should plan on spending 15-30 minutes unloading. After 30 minutes staff will come around to check as we want to flow in and out to be as efficient as possible. Please plan ahead. THERE WILL BE NO VEHICLE ACCESSS ON SATURDAY.

Camping – We will be camping in campsites this year. Each unit will be assigned a camping location based on the size of their troop.

Saturday Campfire

The Camporee campfire features, songs, skits, and sagas. In your guide book is a form for your patrols to select a song or skit to perform at the Campfire. We ask you to talk with your Senior Patrol Leader and come up with some ideas. Please use the theme of the Camporee in developing ideas for skits. There will also be an Order of the Arrow Call-out ceremony. Scoutmasters please notify the registrar upon arriving if you have boys that you want to be called out on Saturday night for Order of the Arrow.

THE RULES

This Camporee will be great fun and a memorable adventure for all who attend. Your Camporee Staff wants this to be a SAFE activity without injury or mishap. To plan for that goal, we have established a few Common-Sense Rules that will make the Camporee more enjoyable for all.

Leadership: At least two registered adult leaders must be available in camp at all times during Camporee. Please use the Patrol Method at all times.

Scout Oath & Law: The Scout Oath and Law are expected to be practiced by all attending the Camporee.

Campsites: Campsites are assigned based on the size of the troop.

Food: All units will be responsible for their own meals. Arrow of Light Dens must coordinate with their Host Scout Troop.

Water: Don't forget your water bottles.

Fires: No fires will be allowed outside of the designated fire pits and above ground portable fire pits. Fuel stoves and lanterns are allowed. Fires must be monitored at all times.

Fireworks: Fireworks are not allowed. NO EXCEPTIONS

Lantern & Stoves: BSA Policy on fuels will apply. Only adults will refill all lanterns and stoves. Fuel must be stored away from fires and cooking area and absolutely NO LANTERNS OR FLAMES IN TENTS, stents, Adirondacks.

Visitors: ALL are Welcome...especially at the Saturday campfire.

Parking: All vehicles will be expected to park in the designated parking lot. NO VEHICLES WILL BE PERMITTED IN CAMP. Special Needs will be taken care of on an individual basis. All personal equipment must be carried in by all Scouts.

Clean Up: Each unit's adult leaders will be responsible for ensuring that their campsite is clean prior to leaving. All trash must leave with your Unit. Leave No Trace! A Camporee Staff member must inspect each campsite before the unit departs. Please notify registrar if your unit will be leaving Saturday evening.




FIRE MOUNTAIN SCOUT CAMP

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP:

From the South: Go North on I-5 to exit 221 (Conway SR 534) Exit freeway and head east. Continue until you reach State Route 9. Turn north on SR 9 (left at 'T' intersection) and continue approximately five miles. Look for milepost 46. Shortly after this milepost you will see Walker Valley Road. Turn right on Walker Valley Road and continue to the end.

From the North: Go South on I-5 to exit 227 (College Way). Exit freeway and head east. Continue until you reach State Route 9. Head south on SR 9, (at the Big Rock Grocery), drive for approximately 3.7 miles. Look for Walker Valley Road on your left just before milepost 46. If you get to the Big Lake Bar & Grill, you have gone too far. Turn left on Walker Valley Road, and continue to the end.
